

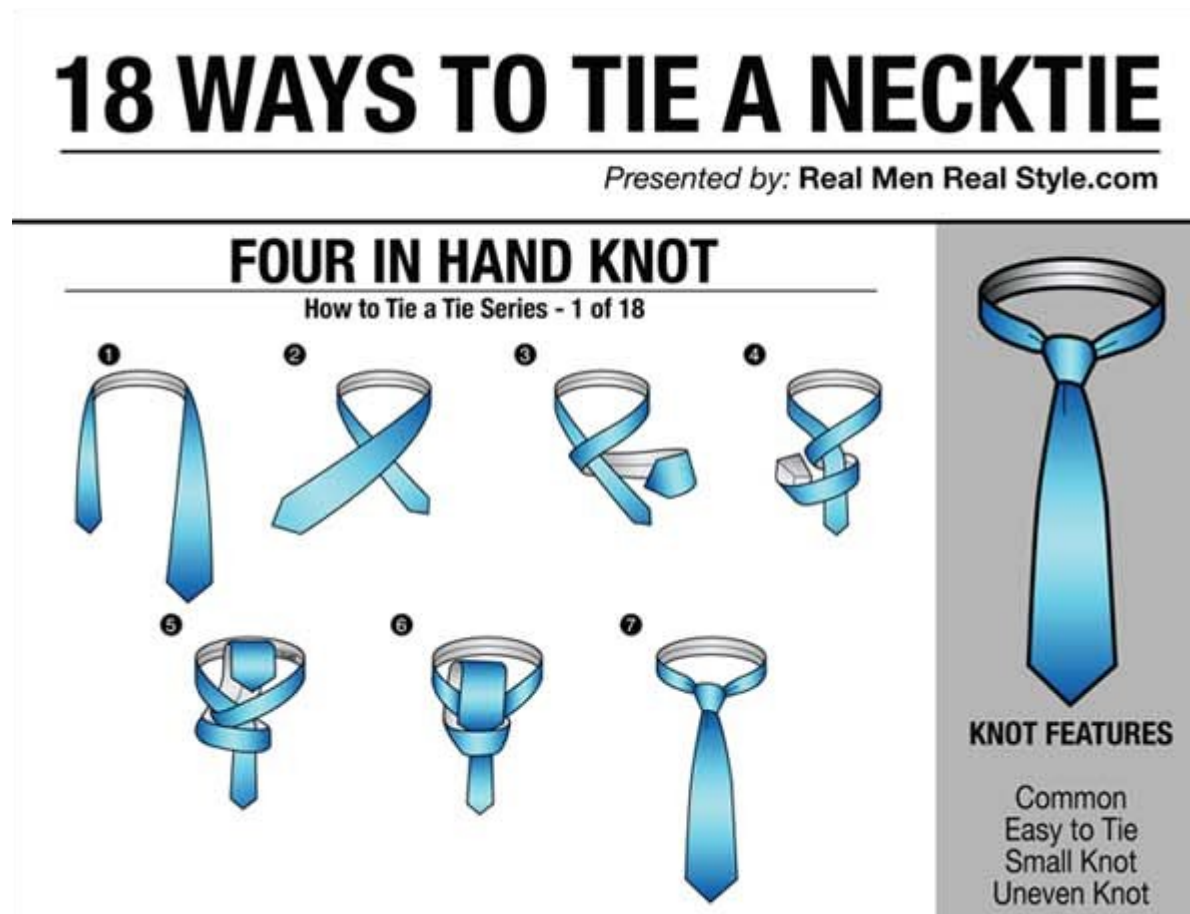
18 Clear & Succinct Ways To Wear A Tie

Here are 18 very clear and succinct diagrams showing you how to tie various necktie knots for work and casual wear. The Knots listed are:

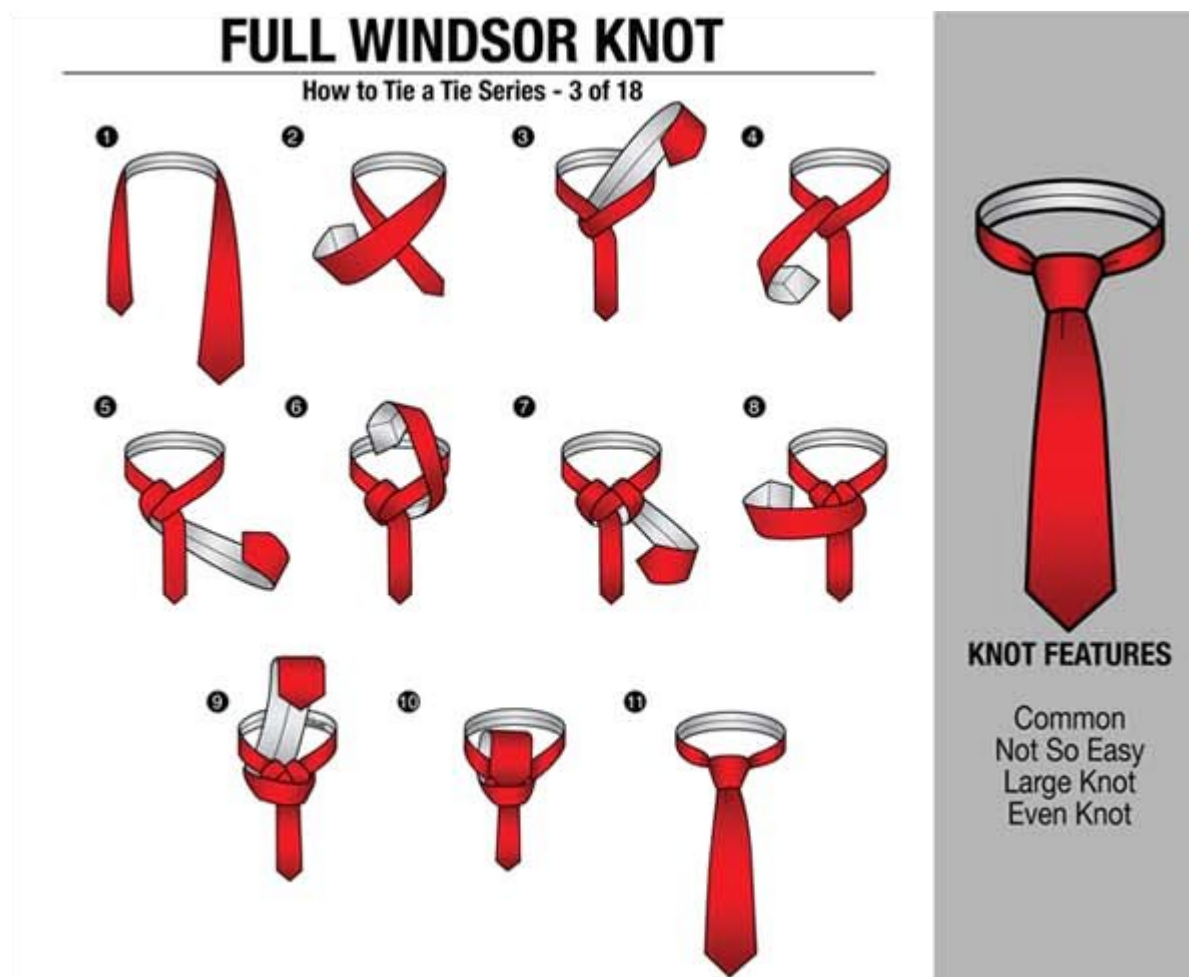

The wide end is brought around the back. 4. The wide end crosses over the narrow end again. 5. The wide end is brought around the back. 6. The wide end crosses over the narrow end. 7. The wide end is brought around the back. 8. The wide end crosses over the narrow end. 9. The wide end is brought around the back. 10. The wide end crosses over the narrow end. 11. The final tied knot, which is a large, symmetrical, and somewhat complex knot.

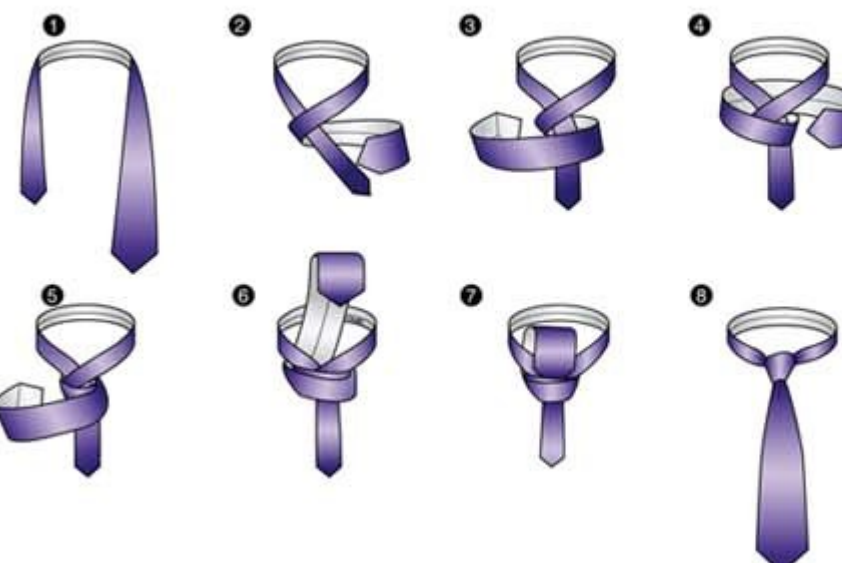

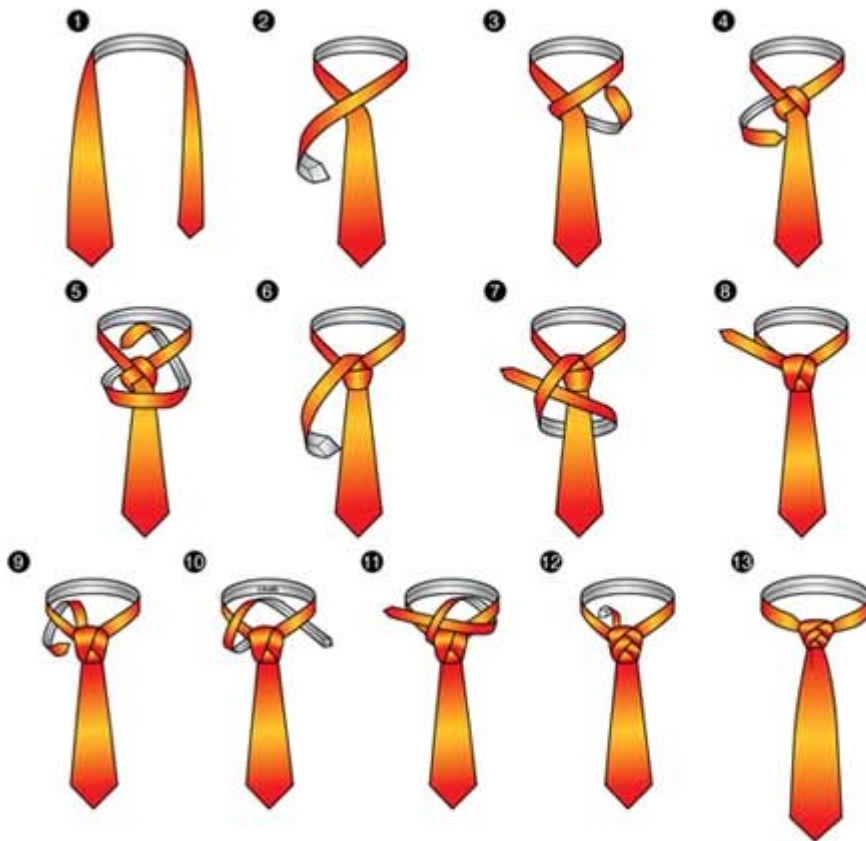
